

Job Description

Sports Coach

Purpose of the post:

To work under the direction of the Sports Co-ordinator:

- To deliver high quality PE and school sport
- To organise after-school clubs and sporting teams to participate in cluster and Island competitions
- To promote PE, school sport and physical activity to raise attainment
- To support colleagues in the delivery of collaborative teaching and learning within and beyond the curriculum
- To bridge links between the school and local community and sporting clubs. Where competitions cause the total paid hours to be exceeded, overtime will be paid or time off in lieu as agreed.

Duties and Responsibilities

To support the Sports Lead and cover in their absence delivering the following tasks

1. Delivering the Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 physical education programme

- 2. Contributing to the delivery of a co-ordinated programme of activities including outdoor and adventurous activities
- 3. To deliver a range of high-quality support and physical activity opportunities to young people in an engaging and progressive manner
- 4. Contribute to the broadening of the range of sport and activities on offer to children
- 5. To support the identification and support the transition of young children into local sports clubs
- 6. To promote physical activity and healthy lifestyle for pupils with a view to lifelong physical activities
- 7. To deliver a range of after school clubs
- 8. To attend relevant training courses to facilitate continued professional development and to use this knowledge to contribute to improving the quality of delivery
- 9. To ensure that positive measures are implemented to encourage the participation of disadvantaged group of individuals
- 10. To attend internal and external meetings as and when required
- 11. To undertake other duties appropriate to the grade and character of the work as directed
- 12. To support the Sports Lead in the delivery of the school's sports events.
- 13. To take responsibility for the organisation of after school clubs and fixtures



Safeguarding

Everyone who works at Yarmouth CE Primary has the responsibility for promoting the safeguarding and welfare of pupils, by:
